Thank you for your interest in Faith Christian School. FCS functions as a board-governed PreK-12<sup>th</sup>, non-denominational Christian school. FCS was started in 1978 as a ministry of Faith Presbyterian Church of Anniston, AL. Its purpose is to give the youth of the church and the vicinity quality instruction in subjects usually taught in public schools, together with specific Bible instruction and Christian standards for life.

1. **Environment** - FCS offers an environment that is conducive and safe for learning. Our highly-qualified faculty members present an excellent learning opportunity in their academic subjects; they also provide their wisdom and discipleship. All faculty members are professing believers and are committed to teaching the whole person with the grace and love that God has shown to them.

2. **Academics** - Students are tested in grades 1<sup>st</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> each year using the TerraNova 3 (formerly the California Achievement Test). When compared with other scores across the country, our students have demonstrated an ability to sustain high academic achievement over time. Our best scores are usually from students who have been enrolled at FCS since Kindergarten or 1<sup>st</sup> grade. FCS offers an advanced diploma with honors and an advanced diploma. In addition to all necessary core courses, FCS offers high school foreign language, art, speech, creative writing, yearbook and choir as academic classes. Over 98% of our graduates attend college. Our school is fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and is a member of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI).

3. **Extracurricular Activities** - Education at FCS does not take place exclusively in the classroom. We take many elementary and secondary field trips. We offer sports for secondary students grades 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> and participate in the Alabama High School Athletic Association. We offer drama, student government, and various clubs as extracurricular activities. We also participate in Beta Clubs on the junior high and senior high level.

4. **Bible-based** - FCS gives glory to the Lord Jesus Christ for every good thing in our school. The Bible is taught in all grades. The students also learn about Him through His creation. Curriculum, policies and teaching practices are chosen to most closely reflect the Truth of God as found in Scriptures. We have Christian fellowship at least once a month, depending on the grade. These chapels and assemblies teach the students the unity they have in Jesus Christ.

**THE APPLICATION AND ENROLLMENT FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE!** This guarantees that your child will attend FCS in the slot we hold for your child at Faith Christian School. If a slot is not available or if the student is not accepted after interview, the Enrollment Fee is returned to the parent. The Application Fee (\$50.00) is not refunded for any reason. **Please read the Financial Commitment Statement carefully (p. 8).**

1. **JANUARY AND FEBRUARY: Re-enrollment for current students; priority is given to current students.** New applicants may submit application forms in January and February but they will not be considered until March 1<sup>st</sup>.
2. **MARCH 1<sup>st</sup>:** Enrollment opens to all. New applicants may submit application forms. These will be coded with the date of application. Preferences will not be given on the basis of current enrollment. Preference will be given to students who meet entrance criteria and will be considered in order of submission.
3. **TUITION SCHEDULE:**  
Parents have two options in paying for their child's education while attending Faith. Parents may choose either a semester payment plan or a monthly payment plan. If the semester payment plan is chosen, a 2% tuition discount will be applied. Both plans are outlined below:

### MONTHLY PAYMENT SCHEDULE (10 months)

Monthly tuition is based on a 10-month plan **beginning on June 1** and does not include the months of February and May.

**Timely payment of tuition is absolutely necessary in order for the child to remain enrolled.**

Families with more than one child at Faith will receive a discount for additional children they enroll at Faith. The second oldest child receives a 10% tuition discount; the third oldest child receives a 15% discount; the fourth oldest child a 20% discount, etc. **(This discount does not apply to the re-enrollment fee of \$400.)** Families receiving scholarship grants do not qualify for any tuition discounts.

The School provides textbooks for grades PreK-6<sup>th</sup>. For grades 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>, parents are responsible to purchase the majority of the textbooks. High school textbook lists are mailed to parents and posted on the school website during the summer.

# Faith Christian School (K-12)

## Application process

1. Application is submitted to the school with all necessary forms, the application fee and the enrollment fee. The application should be as complete as possible. If you would like clarification before answering, just write that you “would like to discuss that particular item in the interview” rather than leaving it blank.
2. Applicants should answer “yes” to question 14 on page 7 if they are willing to accept an offer for a slot in a grade other than the one for which they applied.
3. The School will contact the applicants to setup an interview time. If applicants will not be able to make the scheduled interview time they should notify The School as soon as possible. Due to a large amount of applications and end-of-the-year school activities, this is especially important during the in the months of March, April and May.
4. When the entire interview process is completed and all information is considered, The School will send a letter to the applicants. This letter will inform the applicants if their student has been accepted and in which grade they have been guaranteed a slot.
5. The application fee is not refundable.
6. If your student is not offered a slot or a slot is not available, the enrollment fee will be refunded.

## Admittance Policies

**The following four minimum qualifications must be met for a student to be considered for acceptance at Faith Christian School:**

1. The FCS curriculum is a high expectation, college-prep course of study. We have found that students who are successful in our curriculum possess average to above average academic ability. Therefore, all students must show sustained average to above average performance at their previous schools. Students must have scores in the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile or higher on a nationally-normed achievement test such as the SAT. The School will also consider indicators that show average to above average ability. Unfortunately, we do not have provisions for special needs students.
  2. All students must submit to authority and have evidence from previous schools that he/she can obey reasonable rules. Students who have been suspended or expelled from a previous school will not be admitted to Faith. Additionally, the parents of FCS students are expected to hold their children accountable for obeying school adults and submitting to reasonable authority.
  3. We believe that parents are ordained by God to be responsible for the training of their children. Since we teach Bible daily, we want to be in concert with Christian parents. Therefore, all students must have at least one parent who is a professing Christian and who holds to the same beliefs and objectives as found in the *Statement of Faith and Objectives* of the school. This requirement is determined during the interview process.
  4. The parents must agree to the school’s policy that allows faculty members and administration to use corporal punishment (paddling) as a form of discipline when implementing the student code of conduct.

## Rationale for Financial Commitment

Faith Christian School [hereafter referred to as “The School”] makes a financial commitment to those who enroll for next year and likewise requires a financial commitment. Enrollment is a commitment from the parents to pay for one year’s tuition. This commitment to the year continues even if the child withdraws prior to the first day of the next school year or second semester.

1. Upon submission of re-enrollment, you are committed to the year's tuition whether your child actually attends or not. See the Statement of Financial Commitment on page 6 of this application.
2. The School and church take commitments very seriously. Commitments are like covenants, which bind two or more parties together. As Christians we should honor our word to one another just as Christ honors His Word to us.
  - a. Once the school commits a slot to the parent, the parent makes decisions based on the anticipated placement of their child. If the school gives away that slot, it would not be acceptable to say that the parent has plenty of time to “find another school.” That would never justify giving away a slot committed to the parent by The School.
  - b. Likewise, once a parent commits to paying tuition, the school makes decisions based on the anticipated income. If the child does not come the next school year, it is not a simple matter of saying that the school has plenty of time to “fill that slot”.
3. The School commits to the parents to provide a full year of education.
  - a. Expenses for The School include salaries, supplies, testing, textbooks, and various contracts for copiers, computer maintenance, and software updates, etc. These commitments are based on the full payment of the yearly tuition amount. The School cannot undo or adjust these contracts if there is change in enrollment.
  - b. Because the annual financial commitments of the school do not change with the loss of a student, if a student withdraws at the semester The School has less money to meet its financial commitments and its ability to provide quality services is compromised.
4. Increasing enrollment percentages makes it possible to expand programs, implement school improvement initiatives and increase salaries, etc. Even if The School could recover the loss of tuition with the addition of a new student, the withdrawal cancels out the increased benefit to The School that would have been possible with the addition of that new student.
5. A parent’s commitment is also to the other families in the school. Withdrawal from the school and the loss of tuition reduces the quality and effectiveness of the school therefore affects every other student in the school.

Parents should take very seriously the signature to enroll the child. If there is any question about whether the child will attend FCS, then the parents should wait to enroll until they are very sure that the child will attend.

## I. Application commitment

To the best of my knowledge, all statements on these application forms are true and correct.

## II. Statement of Cooperation

I hereby make application for my child to attend Faith Christian School (Grades PreK-12<sup>th</sup>) [hereafter referred to as "The School"]. In making this application, I understand and agree to comply with and abide by the provisions of the School Student Handbook and the rules and standards set out therein including, but not limited to, the following:

1. The School has the right to deny enrollment or to dismiss any student who does not respect The School's academic and behavioral standards or does not cooperate in the educational process.
2. The School has full discretion [including paddling] in the discipline of students while at school. Parents will be notified of discipline that involves paddling.
3. I agree to comply with the school policies and procedures. I agree to bring whatever concerns I have to the proper individual as per school policy and procedures.
4. I will ensure that my child will attend school and school-related activities in compliance with the dress code. I understand I that will be held accountable for my child's adherence to that policy.
5. I agree that my student and I will publicly support the school and represent the school well. This includes behavior off-campus, in the virtual world, and during school-sponsored activities such as field trips and sporting events.

## III. Statement of Financial Commitment

### Fall Semester Withdrawals

We understand that after signing this enrollment form and being accepted into the next semester's enrollment, if we withdraw our child(ren) from FCS **we remain responsible for paying the full semester tuition**. This is a mutual agreement binding on both parties in which The school has agreed to hold the slot for our child and we have agreed to pay the semester tuition.

There will be no financial charge for withdrawal if we move more than twenty-five miles from school during the term of this agreement. All financial charges for withdrawal will be reduced by the amount of tuition previously paid toward that semester's costs. Enrollment fees do not count against withdrawal charges.

### Spring Semester Withdrawals

All requests for withdrawal for the spring semester must be made in November. Withdrawal after November's payment will result in a withdrawal charge of second semester's tuition payment regardless of the payment schedule (monthly or semester). **Monthly and semester tuition payments for the second semester begin November 1.**

We understand that if we should seek to withdraw our child(ren) without clearing our financial indebtedness, then:

1. We have violated a moral commitment before the Lord (Matt. 5:37);
2. We have forfeited our right to ask FCS to transfer the records on our child(ren) to another school until we have cleared our indebtedness;
3. We have subjected ourselves to the legally-binding arbitration process as prescribed in the "conciliation clause" which is found in the next section of these commitment statements.

### Tuition Payment Schedule:

**Fall payments:** June, July, August, September, October

**Spring payments:** November, December, January, March, April

- Payments are due on the first day of each month.
- Initial late fee of \$10 due after the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month; additional late fee of \$10 due after the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month.
- **Student may not attend school after the last day of an unpaid calendar month.**

### Summative statements:

1. I understand that the \$400 enrollment fee [\$250 for noon-dismissal PreK and Kindergarten] is given as financial commitment to the school for the school year 2012-2013. The School insures that my child has a slot at Faith Christian School. **If the Headmaster and the School Board Chairman accept my child as a student, I understand that this fee will not be refunded under any circumstance. However, if my child is not accepted the \$400 will be refunded.**

2. I have read the Rationale for Financial Commitment on page 4 of this application and I understand why it is that if I withdraw my child from the School prior to or during the fall semester, I will still be liable for the entire fall tuition and must make **payments beginning June 1, 2012, even though my child will not attend.** Likewise, I understand that if I pay the second semester monthly tuition for November 2012 and then withdraw my child from The School, I will be liable for the entire tuition for the spring semester even though my child will not attend. (**Note:** The semester tuition may be waived in the event that the student moves more than 25 miles from The School or extraordinary circumstances arise as determined by the Headmaster.) I understand that to request a waiver of the semester's tuition, I must meet with the Headmaster prior to withdrawal to discuss the matter. I agree to submit to the decision of the Headmaster.

## IV. Conciliation Clause Commitment

### **[Required for admittance to Faith Christian School]**

The parties to this agreement are Christians and believe that the Bible commands them to make every effort to live at peace and to resolve disputes with each other in private or within the Christian church (See Matthew 18:15-20; 1 Corinthians 6:1-8). Therefore, the parties agree that any claim or dispute arising from or related to this agreement/enrollment in school shall be settled by Biblically-based mediation and, if necessary, legally-binding arbitration in accordance with the *Rules*

of Procedure for Christian Conciliation of the Institute for Christian Conciliation. [A copy of these Rules is available in the school office.] Judgment upon an arbitration decision may be entered in any court otherwise having jurisdiction. The parties understand that these methods shall be the sole remedy for any controversy or claim arising out of this agreement and expressly waive their right to file a lawsuit in any civil court against one another for such disputes, except to enforce an arbitration decision.

**Normal communication regarding complaints and/or grievances will be handled according to the process outlined in the School Handbook under "Complaints and Grievances."**

We agree with this approach to resolve any disputes that may arise with our association with the Faith Christian School.
